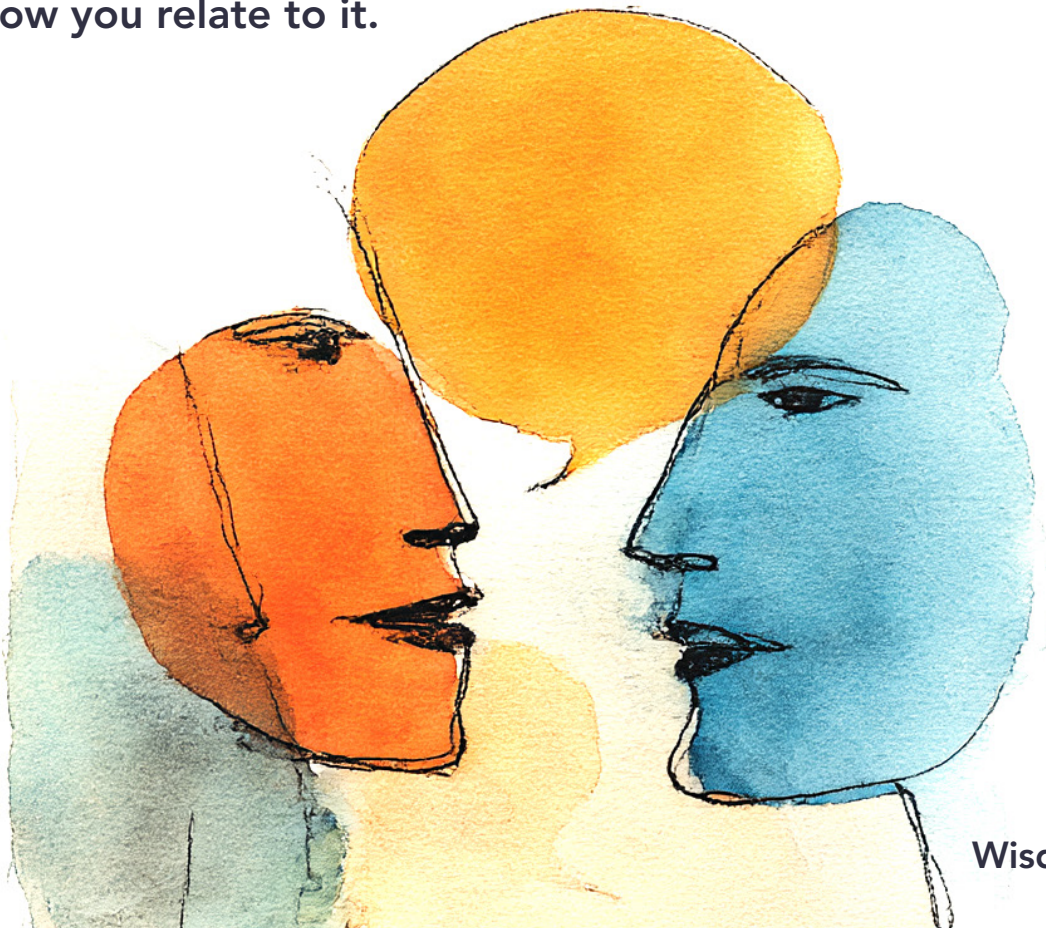
A Quiet Beginning

They come from a desire to stay honest, embodied, and true.



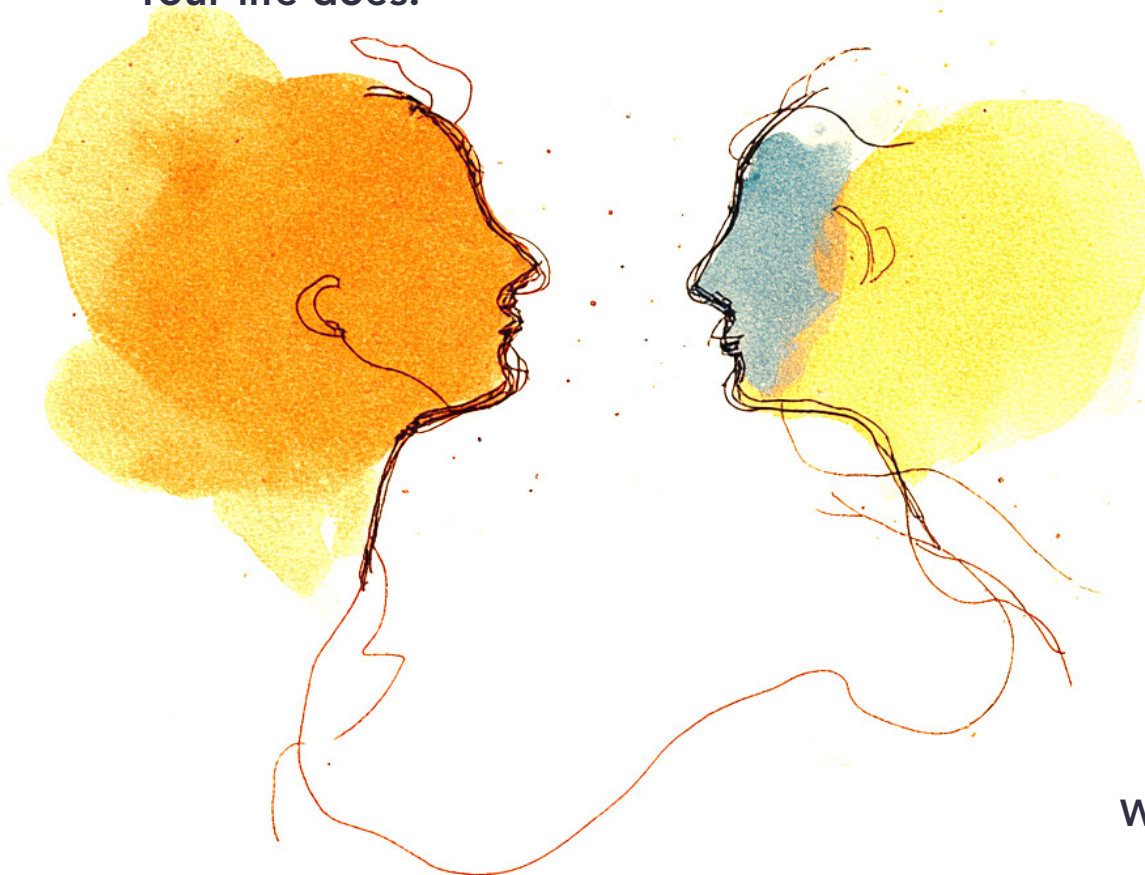
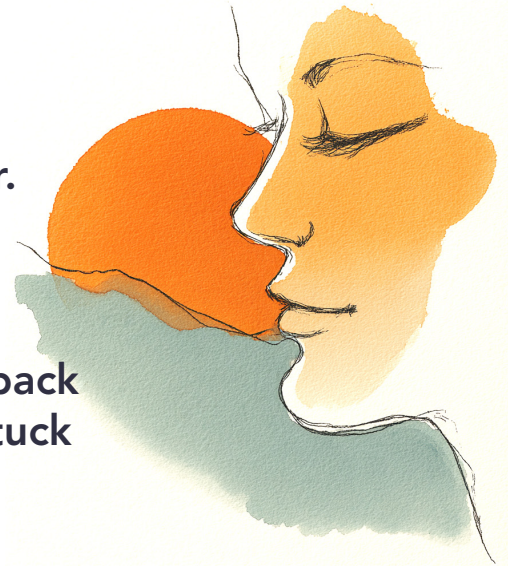
Reframing the Role of AI

Your voice is not your wording.

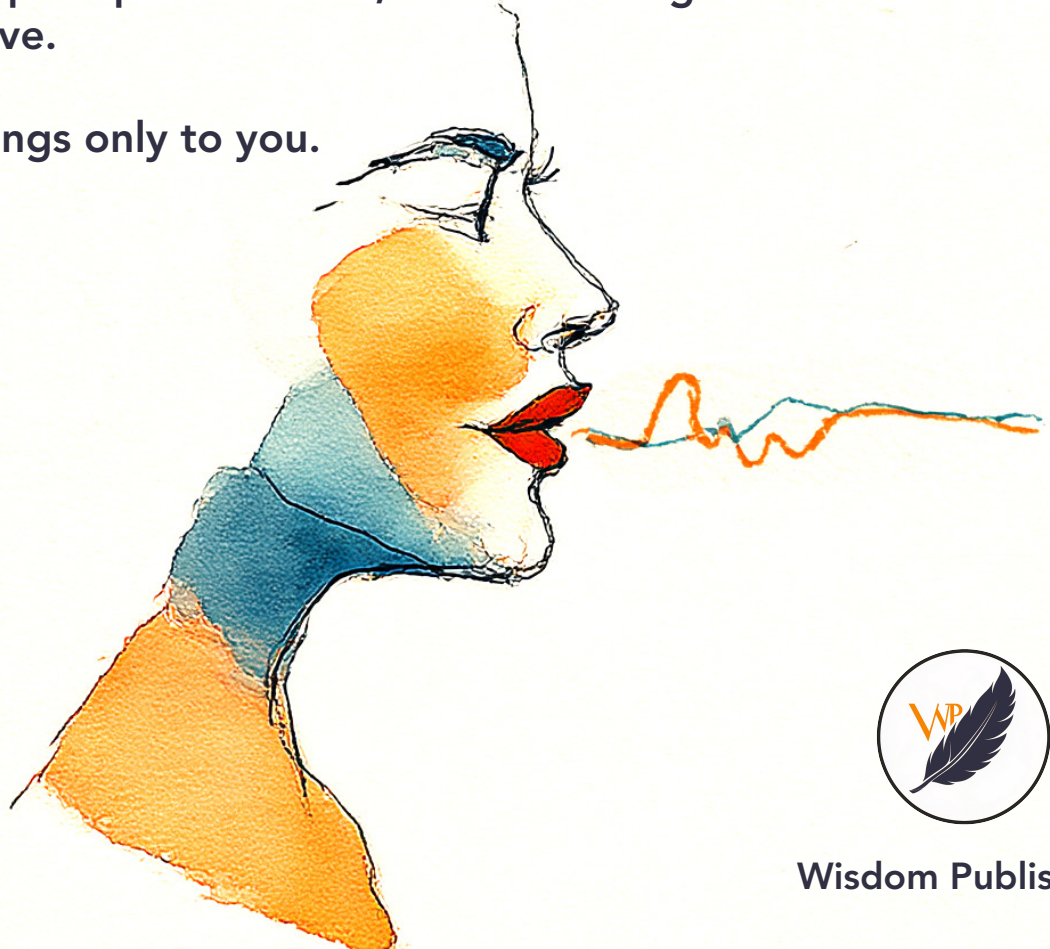
Your voice is:

Nothing enters your book without your discernment.



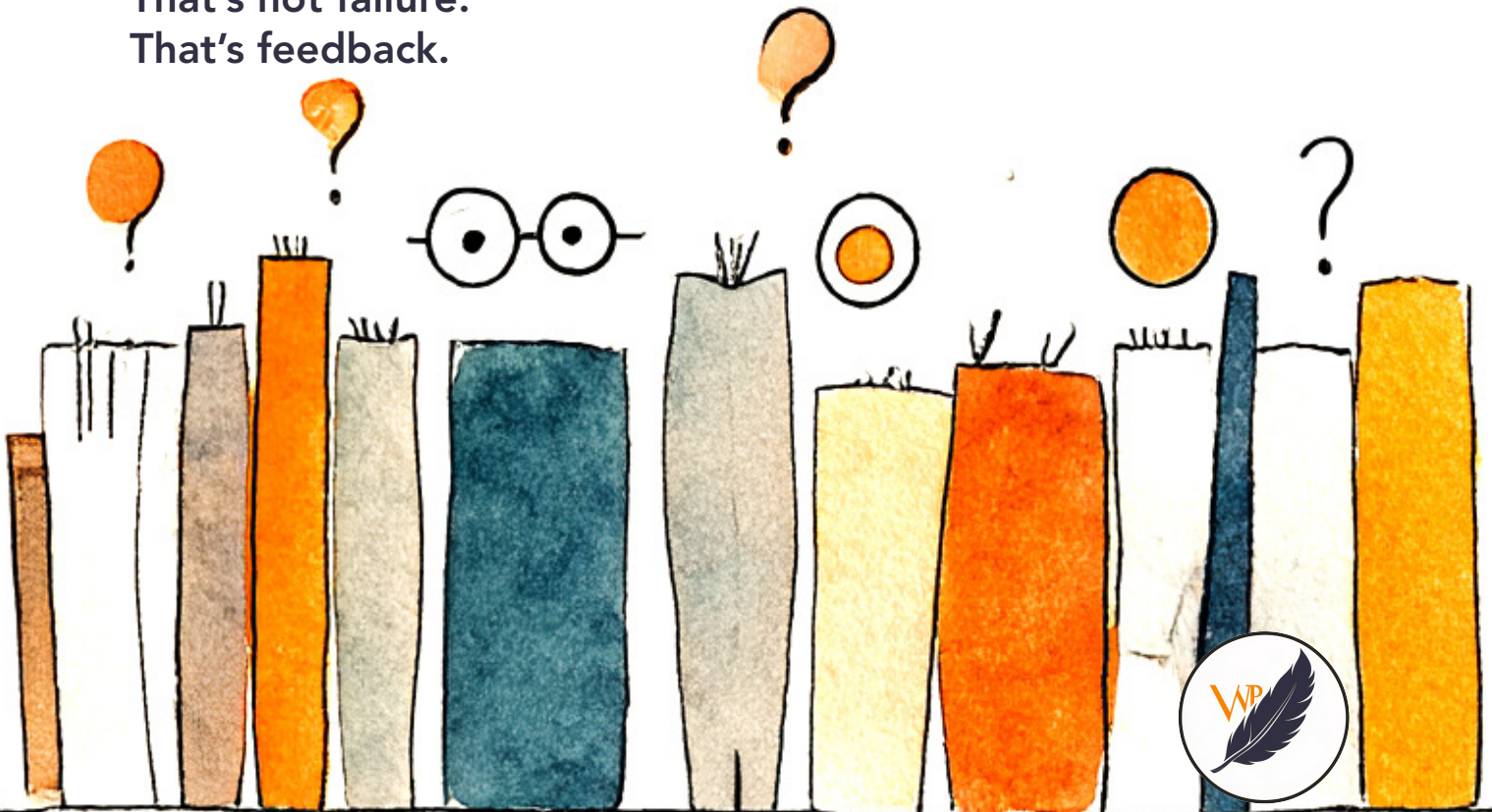
Ways AI Can Pull You Off Course

- You move faster than your inner clarity
- You stop listening to your own sense of rightness

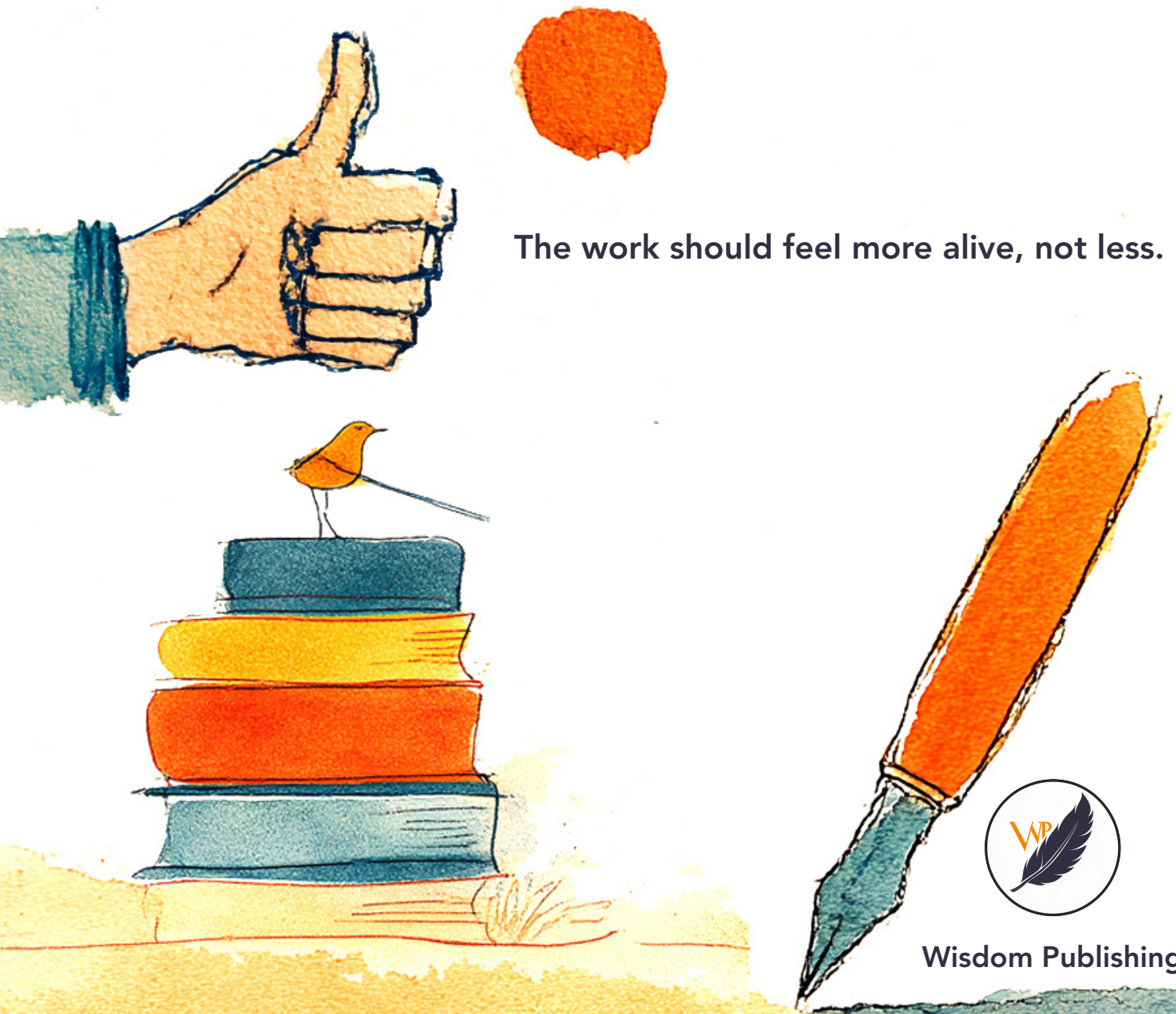
If you feel disconnected, rushed, or oddly empty after writing, pause.

That's not failure.
That's feedback.



A Simple Rule of Thumb

If AI is helping you hear yourself more clearly, it's serving you.
If it's replacing your inner listening, step back.



The work should feel more alive, not less.
